ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

FURTHER YOUR KNOWLEDGE

The Kettering education model combines classwork with real-world experience.

Exchange students like you are enrolled full time at Kettering. That means three to four courses (12-16 credits) for undergraduates and two courses for graduates (8 credits). If you are attending during the Fall Term, classes take place from October to December; the Spring Term is April to June.

Students have their choice of two types of exchange experiences at Kettering.

- **Academic:** One or two academic terms on campus. In-person coursework in your field of study.
- **Academic + Internship:** One academic term followed by one term of academic training in a company or on campus.

CHOOSING COURSES

BUILD YOUR SCHEDULE

You have access to a variety of courses in engineering, science and business.

Plan your experience at Kettering University by selecting your courses. Exchange students have access to the same courses as every other student, with few exceptions. Consult with your home university faculty or advisers before deciding which courses are best for you.

You will submit a Course Request Form to the Office of International Programs as part of your pre-arrival checklist.

SCHEDULING TIPS

- Do not select courses with the KUO designation.
- Include alternative course selections as enrollment is not always guaranteed.

Your academic success is our priority. The Kettering academic regimen can be rigorous. Our terms are just 11 weeks, with the final week reserved for exams. This is different from traditional semester terms. Students will often have homework daily. Quizzes, exams and projects also contribute to students' final grades.

Exchange students will stay in apartments right near our main campus building

Exchange students live in the Campus Village Apartments during their time at Kettering University. The apartments are right across the street from our main campus building. You have your choice of a two-bedroom or five-bedroom apartment. The Office of International Programs will help you secure housing at the start of your term.

HOUSING COSTS

- **Security Deposit:** \$100 (cash required)
- **Rent 5-bedroom:** \$1,600 (discount applied)
Rent 2-bedroom: Market rate
- **Break Housing:** \$300 per person per week (\$50 per additional night)
- **Payments:** Cash or credit card (processing fee applies) accepted

PROGRAM EXPENSES

FUNDING YOUR EXCHANGE EXPERIENCE

Prepare yourself financially for studying abroad.

Finances and budgeting can be stressful.

That's why our exchange program is designed to be as cost-neutral as possible. Students will pay their home tuition expenses, but Kettering tuition is waived. Personal travel, visa application fees, recreation and meal expenses should be considered in addition to those below. Create a budget that works for you and your time studying abroad.

- **Housing:** \$1,600 (\$100 cash deposit)
- **Student Activity Fee:** \$250
- **Health Insurance:** Approximately \$350
- **Total:** \$2,300

BANKING AND U.S. FINANCES

For your purchases, it's advised to have a credit card or debit card. Cash payments are increasingly less common in the United States. Before leaving your home country, talk with your banking institution about ATM fees, transaction fees, currency exchange rates, credit limits and other bank policies.

Exchange students can open a bank account in the United States after arriving (we do not recommend this for programs shorter than three months). The Office of International Programs can help you gather the appropriate paperwork and schedule an appointment with one of our partner banks in Flint.
